

RHINOPHALT® still preserving Saxon Street

➔ In 2015, the stretch of V7 Saxon Street northbound between the A509 Portway and H4 Danstead Way was treated with ASI's asphalt preservative RHINOPHALT®

➔ If you are wondering about the southbound section of carriageway, this wasn't treated with RHINOPHALT® and has since needed further surfacing works; neatly demonstrating the long term effectiveness of ASI's product.
